R-Squared is a statistical measure that represents the percentage of a fund's movements that can be explained by movements in a benchmark index. Standard Deviation is a statistical measurement that helps to gauge the fund's historical volatility.

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Investment Strategy

This investment option invests in a portfolio which seeks to achieve the portfolio's objective by investing its assets primarily in a combination of underlying exchange traded funds ("ETFs"). Under normal circumstances, the portfolio expects to invest at least 80% of its net assets in ETFs that track the performance of a benchmark index to achieve targeted exposure to domestic equities, international equities and domestic bonds. The portfolio intends to achieve a mix over time of approximately 50% of portfolio assets in ETFs that invest primarily in equities and 50% of portfolio assets in ETFs that invest primarily in U.S. fixed income securities. These percentages may vary.

The Portfolio will invest primarily in Vanguard ETFs.

Variable annuities are long-term tax deferred vehicles designed for retirement purposes. They offer three main benefits: tax-deferred treatment of earnings, guaranteed death benefit options, and guaranteed lifetime payout options.
